Dance Marathon at the University of Florida Celebrates its 21st Event

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – Dance Marathon at UF will celebrate its 21st event next weekend, March 14 and 15 at the Stephen C. O’Connell Center. More than 800 UF students will stay awake and on their feet for 26.2 hours to symbolize the long periods of illnesses and obstacles pediatric patients and their families face.

All of the money raised will be donated to UF Health Shands Children’s Hospital, Gainesville’s local Children’s Miracle Network Hospital. The money is used for research, purchasing state-of-the-art equipment and diversionary activities for patients.

“It’s no secret that Dance Marathon at UF has faced new challenges this year. I am extremely proud of the student body for their unwavering support and efforts. In the midst of these changes they have truly risen up For the Kids,” Taylor Chambers, Overall Director of Dance Marathon at UF 2015, said.
